I am proud to build on the legacy of my predecessor, and now Premier of South Australia, The Hon Peter Malinauskas MP, to further

reduce South Australia's reoffending rate.

In 2016, the State Government embarked on a bold initiative to reduce the rate of reoffending 10% by 2020. Followed by a review of the State's correctional system by an independent panel, the State has been driving a fundamental shift in corrections policy that continues to this day.

As Minister for Correctional Services, I have had the opportunity to immerse myself in the amazing work the Department and its partners have undertaken with initiatives to reduce reoffending 10% by 2020.

I want to congratulate everyone involved in the initiatives that have been put in place to reduce reoffending. Through the efforts of DCS staff and our community partners, South Australia now has the lowest rate of reoffending in the nation at 39.3%*.

While the achievements to date are commendable, I believe there is more we can do. This government and DCS are committed to reducing the rate of reoffending even further, and I am excited to announce a new strategy that aims to further reduce reoffending 20% by 2026.

By building on our successes, and working together, I am confident we can achieve this new target and help make the community a safer place in which we all can live.

REDUCING REOFFENDING 20% BY 2026





WHAT WE'VE ACHIEVED SO FAR

In 2016, 46% of all sentenced prisoners returned to South Australia's correctional services within two years of release. While the National prisoner population had grown by 47.3%, South Australia's prisoner population had grown 86.5% between 2006 and 2016 - the second highest prisoner growth rate in the nation. Something had to be done.

In response to this emerging crisis, the South Australian Government launched Reducing Reoffending: 10% by 2020, with a bold vision for South Australia to lead the nation in rehabilitation for people in prison.

HOME DETENTION **INTEGRATED SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM** (HISSP)

Expanded and enhanced communitybased sentencing options for Electronic Monitoring and Intensive Support Services for people on Home Detention.



WORK READY, **RELEASE READY** (WRRR) PROGRAM

Linking people to a job before release from custody, and provides intensive community support for 12 months post-release to maintain employment.
